Readings for the Baptism of the Lord (pp. 407-409): Today's Feast is the last one of the formal Christmas season, and is included therein by virtue its status in the ancient Church as part of the Epiphany, which also commemorated the Lord's first public miracle, at Cana. Together with the visit of the Magi, these three events were landmark moments in the *manifestation* of Christ's divinity: to his disciples, to the Jewish people, and to the gentile world. Isaiah's prophecy and the Psalm today emphasize *peace*: the Messiah will be establish justice not as a conquering warrior but with humility and lowliness. He restores peace between God and man by putting himself in the place of sinners. Accepting a sinner's baptism, Jesus – totally without sin – foreshadows his future acceptance of the Cross.

Working Bee this Saturday: Today we officially end the liturgical Christmas season, so our crib scene will need to be dismantled and stored before we begin Ordinary Time next Sunday. Some preliminary work will be done in the next few days, but there will be a working bee to finish off the task this Saturday (16th) at **11:00 a.m.** The church will provide a burger lunch for volunteers right afterwards.
