Readings for 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time (pp. 545-546): Today's second reading (I Corinthians) is one of the most famous passages in the whole Bible: St. Paul's inspired and eloquent description of what true Christian love is all about. Although it's a favorite choice for weddings, the context, following chapter 12, shows that's it's not just about man/woman love. It's more general, but refers particularly to love – charity – within the Church community, wherein each member has a different role to play. (We're thinking a lot about 'team players' at the moment, with the Super Bowl coming up next Sunday!). The first reading (Jeremiah) and Luke's Gospel, however, remind us that love must sometimes be practiced under extraordinarily difficult circumstances, in the face of rejection and hostility, that require much courage.
