Readings for the 3rd Sunday of Lent (pp. **426-427):** Today's Scriptures remind us that being the People of God does not mean we are less under God's scrutiny and judgment than others. We hear of the ancient Israelites: in bondage in Egypt (1st reading, Exodus), and in their arduous pilgrimage through the desert – marked sometimes by infidelity and divine chastisement (2nd reading, I Corinthians). In the Gospel, too, Jesus warns God's chosen people that they too – *all* of them – constantly need repentance, and that God's judgment will be severe for those who presumptuously abuse his patience and disregard his righteous demands on our lives. During this Lent our nation and the Church herself are in a kind of 'desert pilgrimage'. The perils surrounding the upcoming presidential election, with the sudden death of a solidly Catholic Supreme Court Justice, Antonin Scalia, leave the future of Christian values in American society hanging in the balance; while in the Church, confusion has now been spread from the very summit in regard to a basic moral teaching: the sinfulness of contraception. Much prayer and penance is needed!

Special Collection for the Black and Indian Missions: Today we'll take up the annual collection for missions to the poverty-stricken African-Americans and Native Americans in our land. Thanks for your concern for these brothers and sisters in need. Lent is the perfect time for almsgiving!
