Readings for Pentecost Sunday: Today's great Feast of the Holy Spirit is the third most important in the Church's calendar, after Easter and Christmas. As we celebrate Jesus' birth at Christmas, so the Day of Pentecost, when the Spirit's heavenly power impelled the Apostles to begin preaching the Gospel publicly, can be seen as the 'birth' of the Church, the Lord's Mystical Body. (Seven weeks earlier, unknown to the world, she had already been secretly 'conceived' on Mount Calvary.) The Holy Spirit, the very life-principle of the Church, is active in her in so many ways. Today's readings emphasize the fruits of the sanctifying grace He brings us: peace, patience, kindness, etc. (second reading, Galatians), and His guidance of the Church into the fullness of truth (St. John's Gospel).

May, Month of Our Lady! The beautiful spring month of May is dedicated to Mary. Let's pray the Rosary every day for the needs of the Church and the world!
