Finance summary, July 2016: Expenses, \$9,462.58; Income, \$3,762.83; Net loss: \$5,699.83.

Finances, July 2015-June 2016: Income: \$98,891.02; Expenses: \$111,777.41; Net loss: \$12,886.39. (Without the \$5,000 'Mass Mob' collection on March 20 and two large donations by benefactors totaling \$17,000, our net loss for the 2015-2016 financial year would have been much greater, around \$34,000.)

Readings for the 21st Sunday (pp. 622-623): As we remember in a special way today our church's co-patron, St. Stephen of Hungary, today's Bible readings resonate well with the life and Christian witness of Hungary's first King. The first reading (Isaiah) and St. Luke's Gospel passage speak to us about the pagan nations coming to worship the true God. St. Stephen was in his own way a missionary, as the Magyars were still largely pagan when he became their king. The second reading (Hebrews) speaks to us of God our Father's loving discipline and guidance of his children. And St. Stephen has left us a written testament for his own son – his counsel on how he should in turn rule Hungary in a Christian way. This wise advice is now enshrined in the Church's liturgy for his Feast.

173rd Homecoming Picnic: Today we celebrate our Co-Patron, St. Stephen of Hungary with our annual festivity, and extend a particularly warm welcome to those who visiting – or 'coming home' – to SMV! We are grateful for all those who have been working hard in preparation for this, the most important annual communal event of our church community. After Mass please enjoy our Hungarian food and folk-dancing, and be sure to look at all the great 'goodies' we have to offer in our silent auction!
