Readings for the 22nd Sunday (pp. 627-628): Today's Scripture passages stress the virtue of humility. It's one of the hardest to practice consistently, and yet we are all quick to rebuke its opposite vice, pride, in others. Hilaire Belloc wrote a essay entitled "Sermon Against Pride": he noted that there are vices some sinners actually boast about - their astuteness as thieves or swindlers, their sexual 'prowess', their swift and sure vengefulness against those who oppose them – but that even the most arrogant man never boasts of his arrogance. (Most likely he doesn't even acknowledge it!) Nobody is proud of being proud! The wise man in today's first reading says, "Humble yourself more, the greater you are". Our Lord teaches in today's Gospel a paradox that complements that teaching: precisely those who humble themselves will become great - in God's sight. Our city's holy patron, whose Feast-Day was last Thursday, was exemplary in both these ways. St. Louis, the greatest and most powerful ruler of his time, habitually fulfilled Jesus' exhortation to give banquets inviting the poor who could not return the invitation, and serving them with his own royal hands! God in turn has exalted Louis forever!
